Carmarthen



Carmarthen is an attractive town set on the banks of the River Towy with stunning landscapes and scenery, nestled between Pembrokeshire and the Gower Peninsula. Explore the idyllic coastline of Carmarthen Bay in the west, the beautiful Brechfa Forest at the centre, and the mountains of Brecon Beacons National Park in the east. Discover historic towns such as Laugharne, which inspired the work of Welsh poet, Dylan Thomas and explore the beautiful National Botanic Garden of Wales.







Glangwili General Hospital, located in Carmarthen, is the largest of the four main hospitals in Hywel Dda University Health Board. The hospital provides emergency medicine, general surgery, trauma and orthopaedics and general medical services. Diagnostic and therapies, radiology, midwifery, woman and children's services are also available here.

Glangwili hospital also provides:

- A purpose-built Emergency Unit for emergency admissions.
- The Clinical Decisions Unit providing the highest standard of care for acutely sick patients
- A large modern Adult Critical Care Unit
- Stroke Unit with a dedicated stroke team
- Core cardiac services for the population of Carmarthenshire
- Gastrointestinal bleed services for the southern area of the University Health Board.



Transport Links

Carmarthen offers excellent transport links with close proximity to the M4. There are good road and rail links to Pembrokeshire in the west and Cardiff and England to the east. For LIFT posts, there is an element where you will need to attend clinics and GP placements in rural settings. Therefore, public transport maybe limited. Having access to a vehicle is an advantage.

Hospital Provided Accommodation

All Foundation Doctors in Wales are offered free hospital accommodation for the duration of their Foundation Year 1.

In the unlikely event that there is not accommodation available, you will be able to claim expenses for this period instead.

Below we have briefly outlined the accommodation that is available within this Health Board:

- The F1 doctor's accommodation is conveniently located on the Glangwili hospital site, in close proximity to the Medical Education Centre.
- All Foundation doctors have access to the Doctor's Mess which has Sky TV, Wifi, pool table and a kitchen area.
- Single rooms are provided, with some flats for married accommodation which may be available to rent, subject to availability.
- There is a carpark for residents' use on the hospital site.

The trainee will have the opportunity to have exposure to, and be involved in the active management of a wide range of luminal and hepatology related conditions that are seen as an in-patient in Prince Phillip Hospital including complex inflammatory bowel disease, Decompensated liver disease, Gastrointestinal malignancies and advanced nutritional related pathologies. The trainee will benefit from regular consultant ward rounds and bed side teaching that will build knowledge and clinical reasoning. All members of the team are encouraged to seek out educational opportunities in particular attending outpatients to both observe and see patients themselves. Specialist clinics run regularly in PPH including complex IBD, Liver disease comprising of viral hepatitis and post liver transplant follow up alongside general gastroenterology referrals.

There will also be an opportunity to attend the endoscopy department to observe both Upper and lower Gastrointestinal endoscopy which will include therapeutics, and all



trainees are expected to complete the attachment being competent in performing abdominal paracentesis.

Alongside their usual ward duties the junior doctor will also be part of the general medical rota and have the opportunity to see acutely unwell medical patients being admitted to the acute medical assessment unit while being a part of the Medical emergency Team (MET) and attending acute stroke thrombolysis calls.

This post will introduce the doctor to the full range of rheumatological disorders through attending 4 outpatient clinics per week, the rheumatology day unit and seeing ward referrals with one of the 3 rheumatology consultants. There will be the opportunity to develop specialty specific procedural skills such as therapeutic intramuscular, intraarticular injections, and soft tissue injections depending on the preference of the doctor.



Blood results from clinics will be the responsibility of the doctor to check daily and any unexpected abnormal results can be discussed with the clinician who last saw the patient in clinic.

There will be time to become familiar with drug counselling and monitoring, prescreening investigations for DMARDs and biologic therapies and to develop knowledge about chronic disease management. IT skills can be developed through the use of our electronic patient record and communication skills, by the doctor seeing patients in clinic and then presenting their findings to the consultant who will then see the patient with the doctor. There will be time during the week for a quality improvement activity, or case study to be done. There is an on call medical rota commitment and engagement with weekly junior doctor teaching, journal club and grand rounds will be encouraged.

The F1 doctor is part of a team which includes two consultant haematologist, an associate specialist, staff grade doctor, an F2 doctor and a haematology specialist nurse. Consultant led ward rounds occur every Monday and Thursday. The team also has responsibility for day care patients attending for chemotherapy, blood and blood product transfusions in the chemotherapy unit and day hospital. Procedures that can be learnt, other that the core competencies, include bone marrow biopsies, PICC and Hickman line removals. There is also the opportunity to gain exposure to laboratory services including blood film and bone marrow reporting.

The Department provides excellent training opportunities in General Medicine as well as Diabetes and Endocrinology.

The Team comprises of 3 Consultants, 1 SpR, 1 IMT, 1 F2, 1F1, 1 Clinical Fellow and 4 Diabetes Specialist Nurses.

The duties include management of inpatients, attendance at Consultant ward rounds (2-3 per week), completion of discharge summaries, teaching medical students as directed, attendance at clinical meetings and outpatient clinics.

There will be clinical meetings in Diabetes and Endocrinology and in General Medicine. Foundation doctors are expected to present clinical cases and contribute to the journal club discussion. All team members are encouraged to undertake a Quality Improvement Project or audit during the attachment.

The F1 will be trained in the management of acute presentations in Diabetes and Endocrinology during their ward experience. Experience in the management of diabetes and endocrine disorders will be gained in outpatient clinics. Experience in managing the acutely unwell patients will be gained when attending the daily consultant post-take ward rounds on the admission wards.

The duties include:

- to clerk and initiate investigation and management of acute admissions,
- to provide medical cover to the wards, to ensure the inpatients are reviewed daily,
- to complete a comprehensive electronic discharge letter,
- to attend Consultant / senior ward rounds,
- to attend and participate in departmental meetings and to provide cross-cover for other medical teams if needed.

F1s are expected to be flexible in their working arrangements.

F1 will be assisting with the management of inpatients and liaise with seniors. There is a daily Ward Round that the F1 needs to attend and a detailed list of the inpatients that has to be prepared before ward round.

There will be exposure to a variety of outpatient clinics and if interested, to work with multidisciplinary members of the Diabetes and Endocrinology team including specialist nurses, dietitians, and podiatrists.

The F1 is an integral part of the Cardiology team in GGH, working with an F2, Clinical Fellow/IMT/ANP (2 posts) an SPR and a specialty doctor. The team is led by 4 cardiologists who provide daily input to the wards and CCU. The team look after 6 patients in CCU, 6 in the cardiac step-down unit and 10 on Towy Ward (with occasional outlying patients). The junior doctors are given the opportunity to spend time gaining experience in ECG interpretation, basic echocardiography, basic pacing and angiography. More senior doctors are trained in some of the advanced techniques and the junior doctors are encouraged to develop a better understanding of these.

F1s take part in a 1:11 on-call rota where they will be on-call with either an F2/Clinical Fellow/IMT or a middle grade. A 'twilight' doctor helps in the evenings. There is also a night nurse practitioner on at night to support. There is a consultant presence from 8am-8pm Monday to Friday and for much of the weekend. There is always a consultant on-call from home who is available 24/7.

The F1s are supported to attend educational events in the postgraduate department and are given careers advice and support from the consultants. They are also supported to fulfil the curriculum requirements.

This placement provides the trainee with an opportunity to learn the management of patients with acute stroke and their rehabilitation, the management of Parkinson's disease, learn the principles of rehabilitation, and develop experience in the management of acutely ill patients presenting as an emergency. The department encourages active MDT working, which allows the trainee to develop interpersonal relationships and be an effective team player. The department will provide opportunities for diagnostic procedures and audit. The Team eam consists of 1 middle grade, 3 SHO grade, 1XFY1 and 1XFY2. The main responsibility of Foundation doctors is in the wards. They attend ward rounds and complete jobs when ward round finishes. They also attend MDT meetings in the stroke and rehabilitation wards. The doctors spend 2 months of their rotation in the stroke ward and

The ENT department in West Wales provides the full range of ENT services to a widely dispersed largely rural population. The ENT department in West Wales provides the full range of ENT services to a widely dispersed largely rural population. There are three FY2 doctors and 1 FY1 doctor working with a core surgical trainee and GPST at first on-call level. The junior tier is supported by six registrar level doctors including one higher surgical trainee in ENT, and six consultant ENT surgeons. We have a very strong team working ethos and all doctors work closely together and provide support for colleagues as needed. Duties consist of management of elective and emergency inpatients on the adult ENT and paediatric wards. The on-call rota for F2 doctors covers emergency ENT admissions until 8:30pm weekdays and weekends, with cross-cover for ENT and urology admissions overnight. The F1 doctor gains experience in managing general surgical admissions on-call.

Our department is well staffed with junior doctors which allows ample opportunity for foundation doctors to attend outpatient clinics and spend time in the operating theatre. In addition to gaining the generic competencies required of all doctors we encourage our trainees to improve their experience of outpatient management of common ENT conditions, and many Foundation doctors have been able to start a logbook of surgical cases they have been involved in. This time in theatre stands them in good stead when applying for further training jobs. A significant proportion of our patient group is aged less than 18 which provides paediatric exposure for those doctors considering a career in paediatric medicine or general practice.

Daily ward rounds provide excellent opportunities to see acute urological admissions, present new cases to senior colleagues, review scans, ask questions and learn about investigations and treatment of urological cases. The F2 doctor is expected to perform male and female catheterisations on the ward and when attending Urology CNS led clinics, insert cannula, perform blood cultures and learn how to look after emergency admissions under supervision. F2 doctors are encouraged to attend theatre, day surgery units and MDT discussions to see the continuity of care. Foundation doctors have regular core clinical teaching mid-day.



Due to Covid pathways, there may be the ongoing requirement for F1 doctors who are based at GGH to undertake duties at PPH as this is the elective site in Carmarthenshire. This will also mean that educational and training opportunities will be maximised.

The F2 is an integral part of the Cardiology team in GGH, working with an F1, Clinical Fellow/IMT/ANP (2 posts) an SPR and a specialty doctor. The team is led by 4 cardiologists who provide daily input to the wards and CCU. The team look after 6 patients in CCU, 6 in the cardiac step-down unit and 10 on Towy Ward (with occasional outlying patients). The junior doctors are given the opportunity to spend time gaining experience in ECG interpretation, basic echocardiography, basic pacing and angiography. More senior doctors are trained in some of the advanced techniques and the junior doctors are encouraged to develop a better understanding of these.

F2s take part in a 1:11 on-call rota where they will be on-call with either an F1 or F2 and a middle grade. A 'twilight' doctor helps in the evenings. There is also a night nurse practitioner on at night to support. There is a consultant presence from 8am-8pm Monday to Friday and for much of the weekend. There is always a consultant on-call from home who is available 24/7.

The F2s are supported to attend educational events in the postgraduate department and are given careers advice and support from the consultants. They are also supported to fulfil the curriculum requirements.
